Objectives: This course will be conducted entirely in French. The aim of this course is to deepen your knowledge of French culture, language and literature through constant oral discussion, written exercises and compositions. You will acquire a deeper understanding of the structure of the language while using it continually in class to exchange ideas of your own, particularly those that relate to different cultures students have experienced and to debate multicultural questions raised in the short stories by diverse Francophone authors.

Required texts: John Barson, *La Grammaire à l'œuvre*.
 James Gaasch and Valérie Budig-Markin, *Diversité: La Nouvelle francophone à travers le monde*.

All grammar lessons and reading selections are to be studied *prior* to the day indicated on the syllabus.

Prepare all grammar at home so that class time can be used for discussion of culture, literature and review.

Compositions are to be handed in on the date indicated. Each composition must be typed in a Word document in Times New Roman 12 point and double spaced. Use the Microsoft Word spell checker for French by selecting the entire text (Edit/ Select All) then go to Tools/Language and select French (France). Compositions must represent your own work and not have been corrected or edited by anyone else. Absolutely no computer based translation is allowed. Avoid translating colloquial English or slang word for word. If you must begin with English always break down what you want to say into the clearest simplest language first. It is far better to write (and think) directly in simpler French, than to attempt to translate fluent English into French.

All documents (vocabulary, supplementary texts etc.) that are on our Blackboard web site (indicated with the abbreviation BB) must be downloaded, printed, read and brought to class on the date indicated. Bring in the questions for each film on the day the film is shown so that you can better answer them. Jot down ideas and answers during the film if possible. This will help you remember and improve the following discussion.

The lowest quiz grade will be dropped in determining the final course grade. The final grade will consist of the following:
